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CLD 2013 Conference a Success

Austin CITY LIMIT

The Council for Learning Disabilities held its 35th International Conference in Austin, Texas, on October 24th and 25th. During the opening ceremonies, CLD President Silvana Watson presented Sharon Vaughn with the J. Lee Wiederholt Distinguished Lecturer Award. Dr. Vaughn delivered the keynote address, Why Intensive Interventions Are Essential for Students with Learning Disabilities. Afterwards, she joined a panel discussion with Ed Kame'enui and Don Hammill, discussing language and literacy development and other topics related to the field of LD.

Over the course of the two-day conference, approximately 200 attendees had the opportunity to attend a variety of sessions, focusing predominantly on evidence-based practice, teacher preparation, and higher education. A total of 117 presentations were made during the conference. This year's conference had *two* Interactive Paper Sessions, where attendees had the opportunity to view each other's work and network.

The annual CLD awards were also presented at different ceremonies throughout the conference. CLD was proud to announce three CLD Teacher of the Year Award winners. Icaro Mardones is a special education teacher at Lincoln High School in the Denver Public Schools system. He integrates technology, hands-on learning, and real-world applications in his social studies and science courses to infuse his lessons with purpose and relevance. Lily Ailabouni is a special education teacher in the St. Paul (MN) Public School District who recently completed her master's degree in differentiated instruction. Lily works in collaboration with parents, general education teachers,

and other service providers to help increase student achievement, independence, and positive social interactions, and is currently part of the school's Equity Team. Nicole Park is a special educator at Lewisville ISD in Texas. She currently serves as a transition specialist and is a second-year doctoral student and Project TELL scholar focused on special education leadership and mild to moderate disabilities at the University of North Texas' College of Education.

This year's **Outstanding Research Award** was presented to **Eric Oslund** of the University

of Texas, who presented his paper (Can Curriculum-Embedded Measures Predict Longitudinal Reading Outcomes in At-Risk Kindergartners?) during the Must Reads session. Eric's dissertation examined the predictive validity of curriculum-embedded formative assessments for kindergarten students at risk for developing learning disabilities. He is currently a postdoctoral fellow at the Meadows Center for Preventing Educational Risk at the University of Texas at Austin.

The Floyd G. Hudson Outstanding Service Award was presented to Mark Semmler. This award is given for outstanding performance and commitment by a professional who works in the field of learning disabilities in a role outside of the classroom. Mark serves as a special education coordinator for the Cherry Creek School District in Denver, Colorado. Mark partners with district math leaders to provide professional development in diagnostic assessment and research-based instructional practices for teachers who work with students who struggle with mathematics. These educators are commended for their service to our students with learning disabilities, their families, and the community.

Finally, the **Must Reads** session, a CLD tradition, was presented by **Deborah Reed**, **Beverley Weiser**, **Brittany Hott**, **Kelli**

She has written numerous articles and consulted with national and state agencies in the areas of literacy and mathematics, with an emphasis on curriculum development, peer tutoring, and curriculum-based measurement. Dr. Calhoon has

been awarded multiple federal, state, and university grants and is the developer of a remedial reading program, *Reading Achievement Multi-Modular Program*, designed specifically for adolescents with reading difficulties.

Council for Learning Disabilities Announces: Position Opening: LD Forum Editor

CLD is seeking applications for the position of editor of *LD Forum*, its official newsletter. The role of the editor involves preparing in a timely manner the newsletter content, which should:

- (a) inform the membership about business of the international organization and state chapters, and
- (b) offer brief articles related to the LD field. Applicants must be a member of CLD and maintain membership during the term as editor.

EDITOR RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Commit to a 3-year appointment, officially beginning July 1, 2014
- 2. Annually prepare 5 issues of *LD Forum*
- 3. Assist with recruiting and selecting an Assistant Editor and serve as a mentor for that person
- **4.** Based on previous schedules for disseminating CLD business, confer with the CLD Executive Committee and the CLD committee chairs regarding possible content
- 5. Coordinate the Review Board, arrange for the peer review of articles submitted for consideration, and work with potential authors through the revision process
- **6.** Plan, assemble, and edit information to be included in each issue
- 7. Send each issue to the Hammill Institute on Disabilities for typesetting on a preset schedule
- **8.** Participate on the Communications Committee and as a non-voting member of the Board of Trustees, providing status reports as requested
- **9.** Contribute to the mission of CLD by contributing to continuous improvement of *LD Forum* to meet the needs of our membership
